

# **General Assistance in Surry**

General assistance is a program for people who don't have enough money to pay for necessary expenses such as food, medicine, rent, heat and electricity. You can get an application from the Town Office or download it from the Town website. On the application you will be required to give a list with all your expenses, such as rent, heating fuel, electricity food and other things you need. You don't sign the application until after you meet with the GA administrator, Chris Stark, and are certain that the application is complete. Also, you will be asked to apply for other types of assistance through either the Department of Health and Human Services in Ellsworth (855-797-4357) or Downeast Community Partners (207-664-2424) if you haven't already. You may still be eligible for general assistance after you have applied for another resource.

# **Surry Fuel Assistance Program**

Funded by the donations of Surry residents, this program is separate from the General Assistance program, does not have the stringent guidelines of GA, and has a simple application form. The program provides up to 100 gallons of oil, kerosene, or propane; electricity used for heating; or a cord of wood to anyone who demonstrates a need.

\*Note: Additional resources for Surry residents in need of food include: Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry, Ellsworth: Tree of Life Food Pantry, Blue Hill: Senior Food Program through Eastern Area Agency on Aging, community meals in the area, the Surry Backpack Program and the Magic School Bus (summer) in Surry. #### **Downeast Woodbank**

An all volunteer, non-profit group that provides 1/3 cord of firewood for those who have a woodstove or fireplace and need supplemental heat. The program, based in Surry, serves residents of Blue Hill, Brooklin, Ellsworth, Sedgwick and Surry and doesn't require a proof of need (no application required). Some Town Volunteer Needs:

Climate Action Workgroup - need members. The group is currently scoping possible sites to have a public water handpump for Surry residents for access to good drinking water during power outages as well as for residents that currently have to buy bottled water due to contamination. The group will encourage residents to have their wells tested and will explore grants to provide vouchers for those who need water treatment to have safe drinking water from home. They also will be researching Homeowner energy audits – to save on fuel costs.
